

- □ There a many similarities between the usage patterns for print & digital resources.
















Research Project

- Much of the planned analysis is new and untested; not all of the analysis will be successful.
- This project is distinct from OCLC's collection analysis service.





Data Cleaning

The OCLC Number is used to link the circulation records to the corresponding bibliographic record in WorldCat:

- ☐ For records with an obsolete OCLC No.; the obsolete OCLC No. is replaced with the current OCLC No.
- ☐ For records lacking an OCLC No. which had either a unique LCCN or ISBN; that number is used to identify the corresponding OCLC No.
- Records lacking any standard number were not validated and were excluded from the study.
- □ Records from the 2007 circulation files were paired with the 2008 to determine annual circulation
- □ The resulting data set contained the circulation records for ~30 million different items
- ☐ Approximately 93% of the records were validated; many of the unvalidated records were for non-book materials




Usage Distribution








Obsolescence Rates







Duplication Rate




Holdings by Library Type


Subject Distribution of Items








Annual Circulation Rates




Size of Non-English Collections








Non-English by Subject








Relative Usage by Language









Relative Usage by Subject








Non-English Percent of Collection








Relative Use of Non-English Books by Publication Date

OhioLINK Collection and Circulation Analysis

The primary goal of this activity is to better understand the usage patterns of books in academic libraries: what books are (or are not) being used, how many copies are needed, the ideal size of subject collections, etc.

The study is limited to books and manuscripts since these materials typically circulate and circulation is a significant element in evaluating book collections.

Another goal is to investigate whether there has been a shift in the general patterns of use of library collections in a situation where libraries have instituted patron-initiated borrowing from one another.

This project uses OhioLINK circulation data and OCLC WorldCat bibliographic and holdings data to address these concerns. This is a rare and valuable combination, which has been leveraged through the working partnership between OhioLINK, the Collection Building Task Force, and OCLC Research.

Conclusions

- Very limited use of non-English materials.
- Unique resources widely distributed.
- Circulation rates vary greatly by subject, institution, language, ...
- Collectively duplication level are high.
- Massive amount of rarely used in copyright books.
- Analysis is ongoing within OCLC & OhioLINK.
- Other researchers encouraged to study the data.
